

Seeds are Giant Yellow Single, grows to 200-300 cm high!
Growing instructions: Sow under

cover March—April, 0.5cm deep, in separate pots if possible. Plant out in late May. Outdoors: In situ or larger pots, in May. Thin or transplant to 30-45cm. Grows in most soils, in full Sun. Flowers July to September
