On Monday 14 January we attended the Parish Council Meeting in Ullesthorpe and on Thursday 17 January in Bitteswell to update local parish councillors on crime and policing in their villages.

PC Michelle Skingsley went to the Arnesby Parish Council meeting on Tuesday 22 January to discuss local concerns with residents.

We are happy to attend Parish Council meetings when there are village-wide issues that you would like to discuss with an officer. It is important that you log all incidents or matters that concern you via 101 or 999 when it is an emergency situation as this helps us to help you by channelling resources.

Anti social behaviour

We have received a number of reports of anti social behaviour occurring in and around the Swannington Road Industrial Estate in Broughton Astley, particularly with regard to the inappropriate use of motor vehicles causing a disturbance.

We are carrying out regular high visibility patrols, drivers are being stopped and spoken to and wherever necessary using their 'Section 59' powers to stop anyone driving in a manner deemed inconsiderate and careless and warning them that if they are caught doing it again within 12 months their vehicle will be seized and could be crushed.



Ullesthorpe Patchwalk

On Tuesday 15 January the Police, the Police and Crime Commissioner, Lord Willy Bach, and departments from Harborough District Council (HDC) took part in a 'Patch Walk' around Ullesthorpe following complaints of anti-social behaviour in the area.





Issue raised Action

Lack of communication from the police
