National Neighbourhood Policing Week

Monday 17 January 2022 through until Sunday 23 January 2022 was National Neighbourhood Policing Week and we joined with other forces up and down the country to highlight the work of neighbourhood officers.

The week threw a spotlight on the police service across the UK and the work neighbourhood officers carry out every single day to prevent crime and keep our communities safe. Neighbourhood teams work with councils, schools, charities and numerous other organisations to prevent harm, while responding to incidents as and when they happen.

A number of initiatives were highlighted across the Lutterworth and Broughton Astley area during the week including school patrols, partner meetings, anti-social behaviour patrols, neighbourhood active campaigns and speed checks.

In recent weeks we have received reports of a number vehicle and residential break-ins within the Frolesworth Road area of Ullesthorpe.

The vehicle breaks involved theft of tools so please ensure that valuables of any nature are not left in the vehicle. For those using expensive tools for work purposes these form an integral part of your livelihood and therefore should be protected wherever possible.

Some key points to protecting your valuables are as follows:

| Lock van and close windows | Park your van in a bright, well-lit area |
| Remove tools overnight | Keep receipts and an inventory of your tools |
| Mark tools with a UV pen/forensic marking | Consider fitting advanced locks |

Crime-busting initiative expanded in Lutterworth

A successful crime-busting initiative, which invites residents to improve safety and security at their homes, is being expanded in Lutterworth.

Last year, the 'Safer Streets' scheme was launched in Lutterworth with more than 250 homes in the town centre taking advantage of a free security assessment, professional security advice and free security upgrades.

Now, the scheme is being widened to cover more of Lutterworth, with letters being sent out to residents this January asking if they would like to benefit.

The Home Office funded scheme is run by the Office of the Police and Crime Commissioner in partnership with local authorities, including Harborough District Council, and 24-7 Locks Ltd.

Work is also ongoing to install five new CCTV cameras in Lutterworth over the coming months.

Cllr Simon Whelband, Harborough District Council's Cabinet Lead for Community Safety, said: "We've had a really positive response to this scheme already, so it is great that it is being expanded to cover more homes in Lutterworth. It is completely free, and improving security at your home means you're less likely to become a victim of burglary, so I strongly urge people to take advantage of this opportunity while they can."



Safer Internet Day

Tuesday 8th February 2022 is Safer Internet Day, a day to raise awareness about the safety aspects of using the internet.

Over the last two years, throughout the Covid 19 Pandemic, we have all had to rely on the internet to complete shopping, school, work, entertainment and to build relationships with real people.
