Neighbourhood priorities – Anti-social Behaviour (ASB)

Officers are still issuing warning letters to riders of E-Scooters in the area. Can we remind people it is against the law to ride on a public road or pavement and that under Section 165 of the Road Traffic Act 1988, officers have the power to seize the scooter if you do.

Due to a report of ASB on the park on Frolesworth Road in Broughton Astley, two children have been issued with warning letters about their involvement in the ASB and one child has been given words of advice which we hope with stop their anti-social behaviour.
