Parish Owned Street Lights: Opportunity to Convert to LED lights

Leicestershire County Council (LCC) is offering the Parish Council the opportunity to convert its current street light lamps to LED lanterns and spread the capital cost of the conversion over a five year period. This offer, along with the savings in maintenance and energy costs, makes changing to LED lanterns an affordable option. New LED lanterns procured through this arrangement also offer the following benefits:-

• Competitively priced lanterns – with an estimated lifespan of 20 years

• Significant reductions in energy costs

• Use of LCC's Central Management System to control and monitor the lanterns remotely .

The Parish Council has made a decision in favour of the conversion and would be pleased to receive any comments or questions from residents.
