United Charities for the benefit of the Village - Shiela Carlton writes

Bitteswell is fortunate to have its very own grant -giving charity. The main United Charities scheme was drawn up in 1977 by the Charity Commission to amalgamate three old endowments (from John Harrison, 1782; Jane Crisp, 1790; John Day, 1800) plus a more substantial trust left in 1538 by then vicar Robert Dowse. The 3 smaller funds are largely exhausted, but the latter was based on land gifted in 1492 in the reign of Henry VII and the rents were originally dedicated to mending the roads, providing a Man-at-Arms to serve the king, and to the general benefit of Bitteswell residents

In addition, there is a separate small Crane's Piece fund derived from the old allotments site near the Ullesthorpe Road, currently rented out as grazing. and also a more recent endowment under the names of Jim & Deacon, who in 1988 left the proceeds of their house sale for investment. generating an income flow.

The funds help support social, educational and welfare activities, including the church, village hall, the WI, local school projects, people going on to further, higher and adult education, the village newsletter and a regular taxi service for those needing help to travel to medical and emergency facilities. United Charities also contributes to activities and events such as celebration of the Queen's Diamond Jubilee in 2012 and occasional concerts.

All the charities are administered by nine Trustees: * four appointed by Bitteswell Parish Council, currently John Booth (Chair, as well as Secretary & Treasurer), Charlotte Cowie, Gary Paterson, Julia Pearson * four co-opted by the trustees as a group, currently Graham Johnson, Margaret

Osborne, Sue Sharp and Elaine Turner;

* one ex-officio trustee, the vicar of St Mary's church, Bitteswell, Charlie Styles.
