Olympic Medals for Bitteswell

Robbie Brightwell led the mens 400m relay team to a Silver medal. In the same team was our very own John Cooper, who also won Silver in 400m hurdles. He attended Bitteswell Primary School, where his mum taught athletics. Her coaching was so good the school won many sporting championships. Tragi-

cally John died in the 1974 plane crash just outside Paris aged 33, giving up his original ticket to a young lady desperate to get home to her fiance.



Ann Packer won Silver in the 400m sprint event, a little disappointed she nearly didn't enter the 800m, supposedly she had an offer to go shopping, however she ran a thrilling race and took Gold! Ann and John were awarded the MBE later in the same year.

Ani wee bie Ash

Ann retired at the age of 22 and went on to marry her fiance Robbie Brightwell and settled in Ashby Lane. They now live in Cheshire to be near their sons

I shared many happy times with Ann and Rob, we packed our picnics, kiddies and a little white highland terrier into a tiny Fiat 500. No health and safety regulations in those days, not a seatbelt in sight.
