### The United Charities of Bitteswell

Did you know we have a charity in the village that dates back almost 500 years?

In March 1538 Robert Dowse with Robert Lord and two others set up two Charitable Trusts for the general benefit of Bitteswell. In June 1907 other charities of Jane Crisp, John Day and John Harrison were combined with those of Robert Dowse and the Ecclesiastical Charity of Robert Dowse. Together these 5 charities were renamed The United Charities in September 1977. The Jim & Any Deacon Charity, administered as part of the United Charities was created from a legacy left to the village on the death of Jim Deacon in 1989.

### So, what and who does the Charity support?

One third of the income from the Dowse fund is paid to the Parochial Church Council towards the maintenance and improvement of the Church and Churchyard. The balance is used to support events, and activities in the village along with the support to clubs, the newsletter and societies in the Village.

The income from the Jim & Amy Deacon fund is used to fund taxis for villagers needing transport for hospital appointments when no other transport is available to them.

The Charities also give grants to students starting further educational courses and if you are starting University this Autumn please contact John Booth (john7319@gmail.com) so that the Trustees can consider your application.

### In 2022 the Charity gave grants as follows:

Queen's Platinum Jubilee Event £1000
Contribution towards Village Green Maintenance £700
Taxis £421
Educations grants £5,325
St. Mary's School Grant £300
Local Food Bank £1000

And so far this year it's supported the Kings Coronation event on the Village Green, and given a grant for equipment and kit for Bitteswell Cricket Club.

The Trustees meet once a quarter in the Village Hall and the Charity currently has a Vacancy for a Trustee so if you are interested in giving a little bit of time back to support the village, please contact John Booth for details (john7319@gmail.com
