Farewell

It is 'bittersweet' as we move from Bitteswell Village to Guildford to be near family. We first came to Lutterworth in 1984 when Clive was appointed Principal of Lutterworth Grammar School. In 1995 we moved to Docklands but when in 2000 we decided it was time to put down our roots the decision was to return to Leicestershire. This is when we bought Dowell House. The 19 years we have lived in Bitteswell have been very special. We have enjoyed being part of this lovely village with its friendliness and its many activities. Dowell House has an interesting history. It was built in 1780 by a long established Bitteswell yeoman farming family, the Dowells. The longevity of the family's residence in the village can be gauged by the number of Dowell (earlier Duell) Swithland slate gravestones in the churchyard which pre-date the house. Members of the Dowell family were in continuous occupation of this house into the first part of the twentieth century. By this time, as well as the farming interest, they had diversified into the professions including London law. It has been a privilege in the house.
